



## **Considerations for high school graduates with ADHD who are attending college**

- 1) During the summer prior to starting college, establish a relationship with an internal medicine or family practice doctor. This will avoid a disruption in your ability to fill your prescriptions for ADHD medications. We have "Transfer of Record" request forms on our website ([www.northfultonpediatrics.com](http://www.northfultonpediatrics.com)), or you may request them at your child's final check-up in our office.
- 2) Should your child require special academic accommodations (e/g/, extra time for tests, assistance with note taking, recorder, or laptop use, etc.), confirm with the college in advance that this is available.
- 3) Some colleges may require a recent (within the past three years) copy of your child's psychoeducational testing should you be requesting special accommodations.
- 4) If your child requires a current evaluation, a good place to start is the regents center/student center at their college. Georgia State University (GSU) offers college level testing for students who will be attending or already enrolled in Georgia colleges.
